



Thank you for signing up to support distribution of the COVID-19 vaccine in New Orleans! Volunteers will be an integral part of distribution efforts. This document outlines the current introductory training plan for volunteers, and will be subject to change as more information becomes available and as additional training opportunities are identified.

This basic training plan is targeted for volunteers who will be serving in operational, logistical, and vaccinator support roles at vaccine sites. Vaccine administration sites will vary in location, size, target population, and more. This training plan is designed to prepare you for a dynamic volunteering role, and specific task-orientations will occur onsite.

Additional training (outside of this document) will be required of licensed volunteers who will be administering vaccines to patients.

### **Required Trainings**
