



your flood risk 1 Plant a rain garden, a landscaped area that stores & filters rainwater 2 Collect & reuse rain runoff from your roof in a rain barrel 3 Clean your gutters to protect your home from rain 4 Install permeable pavement to allow water to soak into the ground instead of flooding the street





